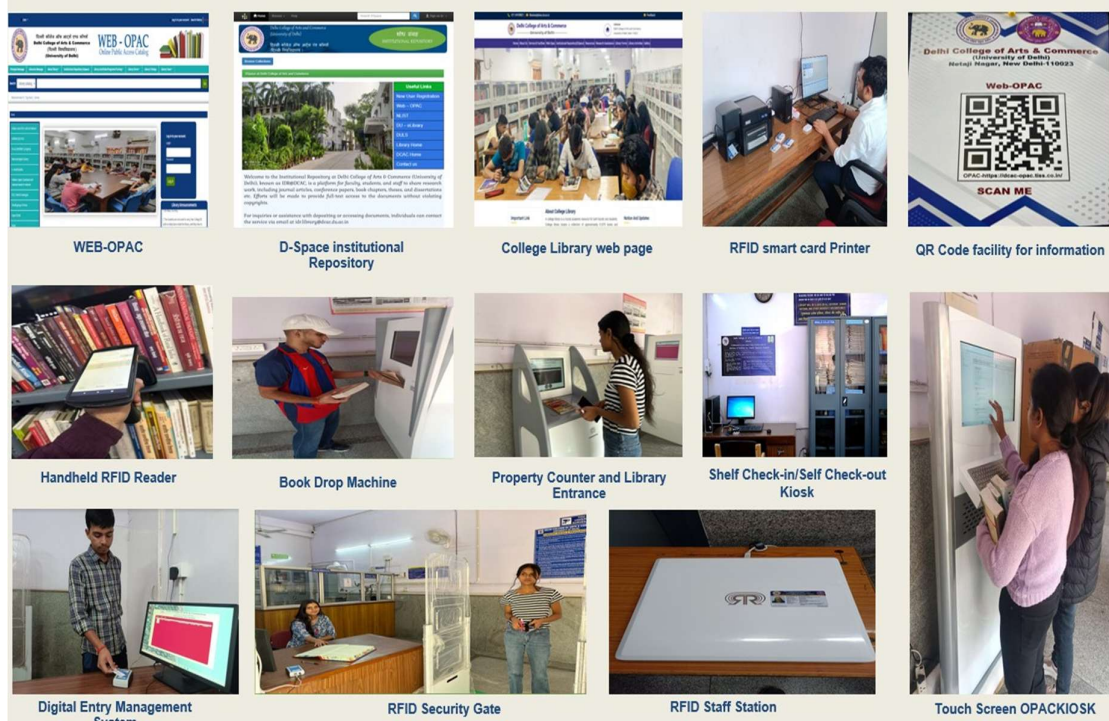
**COLLEGE LIBRARY ANNUAL REPORT  
(2024-2025)**

A library's mission goes far beyond the preservation of knowledge, it plays a pivotal role in fostering a passion for learning and creating an environment that nurtures both academic and personal growth. A college library serves as a gateway to the knowledge, offering not only the resources and information needed for academic success but also the inspiration and motivation that encourage intellectual curiosity and personal development. By supporting students in their educational journeys, a library cultivates an atmosphere where creativity, critical thinking, and lifelong learning flourish.



The library is fully automated, utilizing KOHA, an open-source integrated software hosted on a cloud server, which includes web-OPAC (Online Public Access Catalogue) facilities for seamless access to library resources. It employs RFID (Radio Frequency Identification) technology to enhance library management, featuring RFID-enabled library cards, a self-circulation desk for quick and efficient book borrowing and returning, and automated email notifications for each transaction. Additionally, a digital entry system is in place for students, staff, and faculty to easily access the library, ensuring secure and controlled entry. The library also hosts a Dspace institutional repository on the cloud, providing a platform for managing and archiving institutional publications. With the implementation of self-service kiosks, users can independently issue, return, or renew books using RFID technology, ensuring a fast and user-friendly experience. The library is fully computerized, offering internet access and Wi-Fi connectivity, while the reading rooms are air-conditioned for a comfortable study environment. These advanced systems work together to create a modern, efficient, and technology-driven library experience for students and staff.

## Innovative Technologies in the Library: Overview of Software and Systems



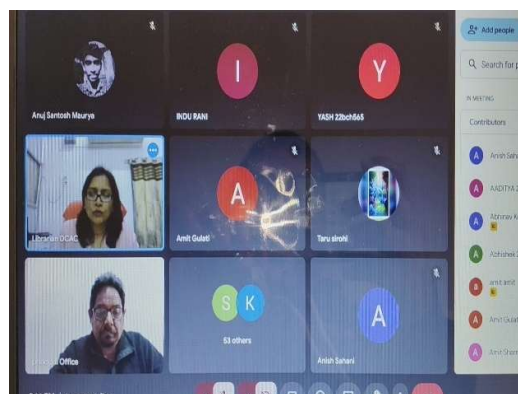
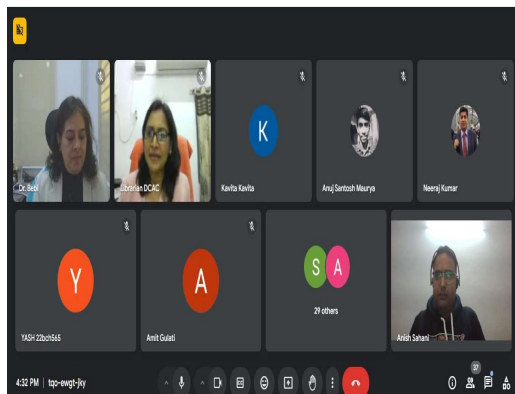
The library has added following new facilities/features in the year 2024-25:

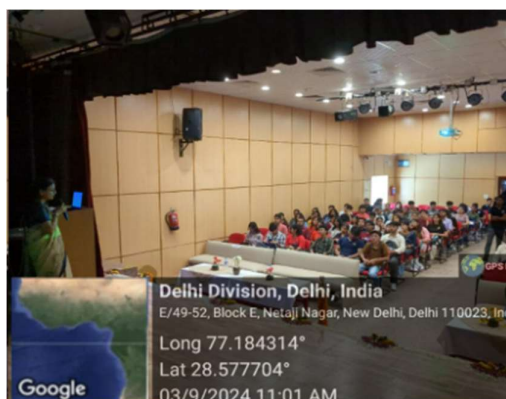

<b>Institutional Repository</b>	The college library hosts its Institutional Repository on the cloud using DSpace software, providing 24/7 access from anywhere. Users can easily access previous and current year syllabi and question papers through this platform, ensuring convenient and anytime access to essential academic resources.

<b>Membership and college smart ID card</b>	The college library has issued RFID smart cards to all students and faculty, providing secure and efficient access to library services, ensuring seamless entry and enhanced user experience.

**Library Activities:** The library organizes a variety of activities and learning programs to encourage students to actively engage with and fully utilize its resources.

- **Webinar on "Research Ethics and Academic Publishing :** On February 10, 2025, the library, in collaboration with IQAC, hosted a webinar organized by the College Library of Delhi College of Arts and Commerce. The event featured guest speakers from Punjab University and Ramanujan College, University of Delhi.



- **Orientation Program:** On 03-09-2024, the library held an orientation session in Swami Vivekanand Hall to familiarize new students with its services and resources. The program covered library features such as book issue/return procedures, e-resource access, and the use of Web-OPAC, RFID self-issue/return machines, touch-screen kiosks, as well as library rules and book arrangement.



- **Book Exhibition:** The college library organized a book exhibition to showcase a wide range of collections, featuring reputed vendors, publishers, and distributors offering significant discounts. Faculty also had the opportunity to recommend books by exploring the content in person.



- **Librarian's Day Celebration:** The college library organized a bookmark competition on 12th August 2024, marking the birth anniversary of Padma Shri Dr. S.R. Ranganathan. Prizes were awarded to the top three winners, along with cash prizes. Additionally, a guest speaker delivered a lecture in honor of Dr. Ranganathan.



- Users feedback practice through different formats: User feedback is collected on all aspects of library services formally through suggestion box and feedback forms.
- The library has provided Wi-Fi access in reading rooms based on student requests.
- The library is in the process of implementing a payment gateway in KOHA for overdue fines and electric points in reading areas for charging laptops of students and faculty.
- **Initiative in pipe line:** To promote reading habits among students, the library plans to award the "Best Library Reader" prize to at least two students.
