The English Literary Association, Department of English, Delhi College of Arts & Commerce organised the following activities during the academic year, 2022 - 2023:


July, 2022

I.

faculty members of the department. It concluded with an engaging questions and answers session. Deepti Chauhan delivered the vote of thanks.








II.




III.






August, 2022

The event was hosted and moderated by Rajat Kumar.










II.

In the series of In-house lectures, the association hosted a lecture by Dr. Vinita Gupta Chaturvedi on the 24th of August 2022. Dr. Chaturvedi delivered an insightful lecture on "Early Twentieth Century Modernism: Period of Rebellious Adolescence or Lingering Lineage?"

Sarahna Prasad introduced and welcomed the speaker. Dr. Chaturvedi began with a discussion of the movements in art and literature of the 19th and 20th century and traced the roots of change that resulted in the making of Modernism. She further spoke about the impact of revolutionary impulses in the performing and visual arts, such as music, drama, and dance. The lecture concluded with a discussion of early 20th-century literary experiments such as expressionism, primitivism, cubism, dadaism, stream of consciousness, and surrealism.

The lecture was well - attended by the students from various departments of the college and the faculty members of the Department of English. A vote of thanks was delivered by Deepti Chauhan.

Singh and Mr. Amit Kumar Yadav also shared their observations. It was an insightful session for one and all.








September, 2022

I.

The English Literary Association, Department of English in collaboration with Northeast Cell and IQAC organised a guest lecture on 13th September 2022 where Dr. Billie Thoidingjam Guarino, 2022 CAORC-INYA Scholars Fellow, delivered a lecture on the topic "Writing Conflict: Contemporary Women's Voices from Northeastern India".

In the session, Dr. Guarino shed light on the themes of race, gender, and sexuality in the works of the women writers from the region. The lecture commenced with an overview of the heterogeneity of the region and the prevalent socio-historical conflict. During war, the issues of domestic violence against women always gained prominence; Rape was used as a systemic war against Ngangas, alongwith brutal assaults on the trans-people. She then took up various works of the women writers of the region like Temsula Ao and Soibam Haripriya to highlight the accomodation of the voice of dissent and the political rootedness in such works. In the process, she also took us through the struggles of women, children, and the non-binary, the categories generally deprived of a voice.

The guest was introduced by Gunjan Saini and welcomed by TIC, Department of English, Mr. Jeremiah Pame. The lecture was attended by 47 students and Faculty members. It was followed by an engaging question and answer session. Finally, the vote of thanks was delivered by Mr. Amit Kumar Yadav.


The event concluded with the announcement of the next Feature Friday's screening details.


The event ended with Ms. Meera Malhan of the Department of Economics delivering the vote of thanks.


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


October, 2022

He then addressed the questions of the audience members. The event ended with the vote of thanks delivered by Dr. Smita Banerjee.








II.






III.








II.



IV.










V.






January 2023






II.












IV.









March, 2023 I.


and saw enthusiastic participation from students across colleges. This competition was won by Yash Upadhyay, followed by Sejal Arora and Nishka Kumar.






